We are very proud of you. You are our hero and always have been. We hope to have many more happy times like this together."

Douglas joined the 9th Battalion, Royal Fusiliers during the Second World War. As well as a qualified mortar gunner, Douglas was a tank driver in North Africa and Italy. He was captured and taken prisoner in September 1943 and held as a Prisoner of War camp in Poland until liberation in April 1945. He now lives with dementia at the Surbiton Home where he receives the specialist care he needs to enjoy life to the full.
