Armed Forces Day: Military personnel and council dignitaries join Royal Star & Garter

Events have taken place at each of Royal Star & Garter's Homes to mark Armed Forces Day.

Dignitaries and military bands were at the charity's three Homes, in Solihull, Surbiton and High Wycombe, as part of the celebrations.

Residents were treated to a barbecue and later enjoyed a tea party with live music entertainment. Guests from RAF High Wycombe also spent time chatting to veterans at the Home.

After attending, the Mayor of Wycombe said he was honoured to spend Armed Forces Day at Royal Star & Garter. He said: "I was delighted to talk to some of the veterans and their partners to hear about their stories.
