## Akshata Murty, wife of Rishi Sunak, visits Royal Star & Garter

Akshata Murty, the wife of former Prime Minister Rishi Sunak, met veterans at Royal Star & Garter in Solihull, during a visit to the care home.

She was accompanied by Dr Neil Shastri-Hurst, Solihull West and Shirley MP, to the Home, on the morning of Sunday 29 September.

Royal Star & Garter is a charity which provides loving, compassionate care to veterans and their partners living with disability or dementia, and also has Homes in Surbiton and High Wycombe. The charity has launched new services reaching out into the community.

Mrs Murty, whose husband Rishi Sunak was Prime Minister from 2022-2024 and is still the Conservative Party leader and Leader of the Opposition, spoke to Royal Star & Garter staff, learned about the work of the charity, and watched in-house physiotherapy exercises and activity sessions.

She was greeted by Royal Star & Garter Chief Executive Andy Cole, and Home Manager Katie McCauley, and learned about the exceptional level of dementia and nursing care provided, along with new services which tackle loneliness and isolation among the veteran community in Solihull and beyond. This includes Day Care, Lunch Club and a free-to-use Telephone Friendship Service.

Mrs Murty also learned about the Veteran Friendly Framework, a nationwide project designed to deliver improved health and wellbeing outcomes to the 25,000 veterans living in care homes across England. It is a collaboration between Royal Star & Garter, Royal British Legion and the NHS Veterans Covenant Healthcare Alliance

(VCHA – an NHS flagship Armed Forces programme), with funding support from the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust.

During a tour of the Home, Mrs Murty watched veterans work out on adapted exercise bikes, visited a dementia care area, and then sat down for a chat and cup of tea with residents.

Royal Star & Garter in Solihull is award winning, and was judged 'Outstanding' and one of the best in the country by health watchdog Care Quality Commission (CQC) in its last inspection.
