Veterans celebrate Armed Forces Day

She spent time chatting to residents and was given a tour of the building, taking in the Home's in-house physio room, hair salon, activities room and gardens. Lady Howe also helped to raise the Armed Forces Day flag outside. There were lots of activities in the week leading up to Armed Forces Day, including a themed pub quiz, live music, a BBQ and a 'Pimms' lunch, visits to the nearby Air Raid Shelter Café and Tea Room, and a party.

At Care for Veterans, Worthing Mayor, Cllr Cathy Glynn-Davies paid a visit on Tuesday 24 June, chatting with residents and taking part in activities. During the week residents also enjoyed arts and crafts activities and a special quiz. Photos of military medals were also put up around the Home's Wellbeing Hub, for residents to discuss and identify. Worthing RFC, which has selected Care for Veterans as its chosen charity for the year, also held a bucket collection during

At Surbiton, celebrations took place on Friday 27 June. It started with the raising of the Armed Forces Day flag outside the Home.
