Veterans' wellbeing boost: Renovating Surbiton care home's garden

Work has begun on renovating the outdoor area and garden at Royal Star & Garter in Surbiton. The Home provides loving, compassionate care to veterans and their partners living with disability or dementia.

The project started in February and is expected to be finished before Her Majesty The Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations this summer.

The renovation work is being supported with generous grants from The Monday Charitable Trust, ABF The Soldiers' Charity and the B&Q Foundation.

Work will see the current garden landscaped, making it more accessible for residents. Improvements will be made to the planting areas and raised beds to engage the veterans in gardening activities, and an outdoor dining and visiting area will also be created. New features will include a garden room which will operate as a hybrid space, hosting family visits and events,

training and a place for staff to meet. The garden will also include additional pergolas and decking, a water feature, gazebo and benches and a wheelchair-friendly nature trail through a wild garden area.

Spending time in green space or bringing nature into your everyday life can benefit both mental and physical wellbeing. These include increased confidence and self-esteem and a reduction in feelings of stress and anger.¹
