

Information for Executors

We appreciate the time and work involved in taking on the role of Executor, and hope that the following information will be helpful.

Getting in touch

Please do let us know if you believe Royal Star & Garter has been remembered in a Will. We understand that it may be some time before you are in a position to fulfil the bequest, however knowing about this kind gift does help us to plan for the future.

We would be most grateful for the following details:

- The full name and address of the person who has made a gift in their Will
- Their date of death
- A copy of the Will (or the extract that mentions the gift).

Charity details

Royal Star & Garter was founded in 1916 and has changed its name several times over the past century. You may find the charity included in a Will under its former names:

- The Royal Star and Garter Home for Disabled Sailors, Soldiers and Airmen or The Royal Star & Garter Home(s).
- Wills may also include our former Richmond TW10 6RR address.
- Registered Charity Number: 210119.

Gifts of residue

Where Royal Star & Garter has been left a share of residue, we would be grateful for the following:

- A full copy of the Will
- A schedule of estate assets and liabilities once this is available
- Copies of marketing valuations for any property in the estate

• Estate accounts at the end of the administration, and the opportunity to raise queries

Inheritance Tax and Capital Gains Tax

Charities are exempt from many taxes, such as Inheritance Tax and Capital Gains Tax.

Inheritance Tax

There are special rules for the division of any liability between exempt charities and other, non-exempt, beneficiaries. When the residue is shared between charities and non-exempt beneficiaries (ie friends and/or family), we would expect the liability to be apportioned solely to those non-exempt shares of residue (as per the Inheritance Tax Act 1984, Section 41) when the estate is distributed, unless the Will specifically states otherwise.

Capital Gains Tax

If you think there is likely to be a gain on the sale of a property and/or investments, we would be most grateful if you could contact us to discuss this before they are sold. In some cases, it may be helpful to appropriate Royal Star & Garter's share of assets directly to the charity pre-sale, in order to minimise any Capital Gains Tax liability. This is a simple paper exercise that can be achieved using a short Memorandum of Appropriation, and we would be pleased to provide a template Memorandum for you to use.

Sometimes we may have to ask you for some additional information, as the charity is subject to strict legislation and we must comply with this when receiving gifts from estates.

We would appreciate being kept informed about the progress of the administration, and any potential claims or delays that might arise.
