Raquel, who joined the Charity in 2013, said: "It was wonderful spending the evening surrounded by so many inspirational people. The Surbiton Home offers over 50 events and activities to its residents each week. The Spanish-speaker has even started teaching Spanish lessons to veterans at the Home.

Pauline Shaw, the Charity's Director of Care, was delighted to see Raquel's efforts recognised. She said: "It is a joy to watch Raquel at work. Her passion, enthusiasm and energy are boundless and contagious. It brings out the best in the people she works with, and she is much loved by residents. We are lucky to have her, and I think this award is well deserved."
