Sir Ed spoke to residents, including 100-year-old WWII veteran Phyllis, and met the Home's youngest resident – 35-year-old Stephen Vause, who suffered serious injuries in a mortar attack while serving in Iraq in 2007.

He then sat with staff in the Home's newly built garden room to discuss issues surrounding adult social care.

Sir Ed said: "Royal Star & Garter is one of the most amazing care homes I have ever visited. Seeing the fantastic quality of care given to extraordinary people who have served and sacrificed for this country underlines the value of good social care."
