Care home hosts summer fete to celebrate 15th birthday

A care home has celebrated its 15th birthday with a summer fete for its residents and their relatives.

Royal Star & Garter in Solihull hosted a day filled with fun and entertainment – and a visit from ponies – on Friday, 18 August.

The Home provides loving, compassionate care to veterans and their partners living with disability or dementia, and is rated among the best nursing homes in the country according to the Care Quality Commission (CQC).

Royal Star & Garter is a charity which was established in 1916 to help severely injured young men returning from the battlegrounds of the First World War. Its Solihull Home opened in August 2008, and in 2020, it was rated 'Outstanding' in all five areas of a CQC report. At the time only 10 other nursing homes in England achieved this exceptional standard.
