The family-focussed fun saw kids enjoy garden games like Hook-a-Duck and skittles. The chocolate fountain was especially popular with youngsters, while Pimms proved a favourite among adults.

Live music throughout the afternoon from local band Baz & Dave, The Woodbury Bell Ringers, Kingston & Malden Scout & Guide Band, had visitors dancing.

Kingston's Mayor Margaret Thompson said: *"The Home is wonderful and the fete looks lovely with lots of items made by the residents. I'm very proud to see our community here supporting our veterans on Armed Forces Day, as they support us."*
