Army couple celebrate 70th anniversary at Royal Star & Garter

A couple who met at a dance while they were both serving in the Army has celebrated their 70th wedding anniversary at a Surbiton care home.

Jack and June Keith marked their platinum anniversary on Tuesday 21 March with a celebratory lunch laid on by staff at Royal Star & Garter, where they both live.

The couple will also enjoy a large family gathering at the Home's Garden Room on Saturday 25 March.

Jack and June met at a dance in Scotland while in the Army. Jack, 91, did his National Service with the

Seaforth Highlanders between 1950 and 1952, and was a Physical Trainer. June, 94, signed up in 1950 and served in the Women's Royal Army Corps for three years.

Recalling how they met, Jack said: "June's unit wanted to use our gym for a dance, and because it was our gym, we were allowed to attend too. I saw this beautiful woman walk in and thought 'Oh God, I'm going to marry her!'. Luckily for me, the fellow she was with had to go early, so I went up to her, and that was it!"

Now great grandparents, the couple married in Aberdeen in 1953, and after leaving the Army, Jack worked as a bus driver in Scotland. After raising their children, June worked as a switchboard operator.
