The gigantic gastropod was among a number of exotic creepy crawlies which residents, relatives, staff and volunteers got to stroke and hold, as part of an Animal Therapy Session.

Other creatures brought in by ZooLab on Wednesday September 18 were mice, a millipede, a hissing cockroach, and a rather adorable rabbit.

Research shows stroking animals can help reduce stress, lower blood pressure and increase social interaction and physical activity. It has also been shown to help battle depression and loneliness.
